

An SGH Seminar: Think about Global Issues from Nagasaki

From Monday, June 22nd to Friday, 26th, we held a series of seminars with the theme “Think about global issues from Nagasaki,” to which we invited seven lecturers from Nagasaki University. First, we heard their lectures in groups, and after that, we exchanged opinions in each group. Each group of Year 10 (the 1st year in high school) students invited the lecturers who research the same topic that the students’ are researching, and listened attentively to the specialized speech. Each lecturer spoke about “the importance of thinking about one problem in many views,” and “to continue researching for people in trouble.” We felt their noble positions. After the lectures, the students asked many questions, to which the professional teachers answered in words easy enough to follow. Most of the students said that in order to proceed with advanced research in university, it is necessary to get a rich knowledge and to improve basic academic competence.
