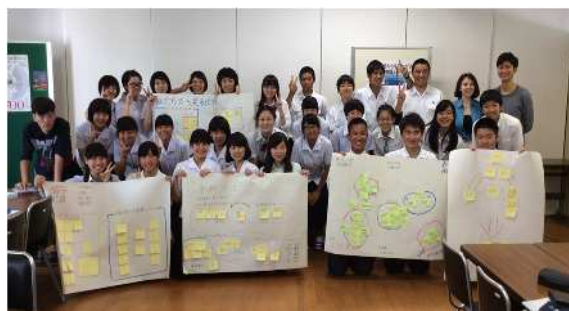


A Fieldwork about Peace was held! (I)

① Sharing the views with Ritsumeikan High School

On Thursday, July 30th, we held an event to share our views about peace with 13 students of Ritsumeikan High School, which is also designated as an SGH. Ms. Hiro Koizumi, a Nagasaki Higashi graduate, and Mr. Fumiyasu Mizokoshi from Nagasaki University, introduced what the Nagasaki Youth Delegation and RECNA are doing for abolition of nuclear weapons. Also, the two guest speakers reported on their observations of the NPT conference at the United Nations headquarters in New York. After that, in mixed groups, the students consulted each other and then presented about what they had discussed. Feeling the differences of peace education between in Nagasaki and Kyoto, they could do an active exchange of opinions among the youth for world peace.



② A Lecture at Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum and a Survey by Questionnaire in Nagasaki Peace Park

On Thursday, July 30th, 30 students visited Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum, and attended a lecture about the peace activities which Nagasaki City does. Also, they took a tour around the museum after listening to explanations about its displays and data.

After that, they went to Nagasaki Peace Park and conducted a survey using a questionnaire about peace to some visitors. Because many of the tourists were from Asia such as China and Korea, the students interviewed diligently, struggling for a better explanation in English. Additionally, they interviewed some local people and the students of the Japan Coast Guard School in Kyoto, who happened to come to Nagasaki. The students got a good response from many replies and found it very difficult yet beneficial to interview people. Some research groups will try another interview based on the questionnaire results.
