On Tuesday, June 21st, we invited Professor Masaki Nagae from the Faculty of Environmental Science at Nagasaki University to give a lecture and afterward we exchanged our opinions. On Wednesday, June 22nd, we invited Mr. Kouichi Morita who is the head of the Institute of Tropical Medicine at Nagasaki University to give a lecture and afterward we exchanged our opinions. He spoke about "the existing conditions of tropical infections" and "thinking about global health from Nagasaki". We learned about the subject of tropical infections, to consider its information and what we can do about it. He explained to us about traditional tropical disease such as Emerging Infectious Diseases, Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD), tropical issues concerned with tropical infection and so on. His explanation gave us easy examples so that 1st graders could understand. After the lecture, students actively asked him many questions. The meeting finished quite late because Mr. Morita answered each question kindly, deeply and clearly.
